Until the city is districted and runoff elections are established in Hermosa Beach, voters will continue to be saddled with council members who cannot get elected by a majority vote. The failure to get a majority vote should not keep the current city council members from appointing the next on the list of the voters.

This is made crystal clear by the voters giving only 127 votes more to J.R. for 3rd place than for Jeff at 4th place and a 440 vote advantage to 4th place Jeff over Boko at 5th place.


J.R. 127 ahead of Jeff

The Hermosa Beach electorate cast 4,457 votes for the two incumbents reelected. The Hermosa Beach electorate cast 9,152 votes for the challengers. As the elected incumbents could not get half the votes cast by the voters, it is obvious that neither Keegan or J.R. could survive a run off election. Therefore, if the reelected incumbents are accepting of the minority of votes they got as a mandate, there is no reason for not also accepting the 440 votes Jeff has over Boko as the voter's mandate.
